January




Capt. Rodney Smith



The water has cleared up quite a bit in areas lying in the northern areas of the Banana River Lagoon. Even though the picture below doesn't show much clarity the water that day was easily 4-6 ft visibility. I am seeing Spartina grass growing close to the shorelines up in the NMZ area and let's hope that trend continues. Below are two pictures I took on different days, one in the NMZ of the redfish and then the trout is still in the Banana River area but south of the NMZ. As you can see, the redfish has the tail of another fish sticking out of its mouth. I saw this fish floating from a distance away and pulled it out of the water as it was already dead. The smaller fish had wedged into the mouth of the redfish and could not get out. As the saying goes, "don't bite off more than you can chew". Once I took my pictures I slid him back into the water and let nature take its course.
